### Changes to Business Rates for South Somerset businesses



On Wednesday 16 March, 2016, George Osborne delivered his eighth Budget as Chancellor of the Exchequer.

The overall headlines include the introduction of a sugar tax on soft drinks from 2017, extra funding for schools to have longer days and a downward revision of growth forecasts for the UK, but what did Budget 2016 bring for business rates?

From April 2017 the existing 100% Small Business Rate Relief (SBRR) will be made permanent meaning that businesses with a Rateable Value (RV) below £6,000 will pay nothing. Additionally this £6,000 threshold will be raised to £12,000, bringing more businesses into the 100% relief band. For businesses with a RV of up to £15,000, there will be tapered relief. Additionally the threshold at which firms pay higher rates rises from a RV of £18,000 to £51,000.

The Chancellor estimates this means some 600,000 small businesses will pay no business rates at all from April 2017, with a further 250,000 businesses benefiting from a rates cut.

Businesses should check the RV of their premises to see how these changes affect them. The RV can be found at the top of the recently received "Non-

Domestic Rate Bill" sent out to businesses by the Council. The RV can also be found online at [www.voa.gov.uk](http://www.voa.gov.uk) together with other information on business rates.

Other changes announced means that by 2020 business rates will increase in line with Consumer Prices Index (CPI) as opposed to Retail Price Index (RPI). RPI often tracks well above inflation. Additionally the five year rates revaluation cycle will be cut to three years to better reflect changes in property prices.

Craig has also been very helpful in advising on finance and has a wide network of local connections, which is of great value to many businesses'.

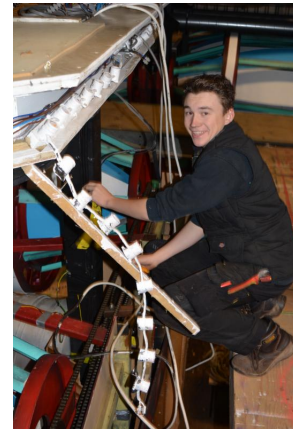
