# A look at two council services

## Housing Standards

Cold damp houses, overcrowding, disrepair, trip hazards, and dangerous electric fittings are just some of the issues that the Housing Standards Team deal with on a daily basis.

Excessive cold in a property, which can cause hypothermia, is the biggest problem the team face in the winter months. Poorly heated and insulated properties can result in damp, condensation and mould. Every year an increased number of elderly residents die during episodes of exceptionally cold weather.

When inspecting properties, the team look for risks such as trip hazards that result in falls on stairs. Likewise, it is important to ensure there are adequate window restrictors in place when small children are present to prevent falls from windows. Electrical problems such as sparking plugs and sockets falling off walls are also regularly investigated. Carbon monoxide poisoning is another issue dealt with by the team.

The team also inspects Houses of Multiple Occupation to ensure they are kept up to standard. With increased housing pressure, more and more young people live in shared bedsit accommodation and it is important to ensure that standards are maintained. Grants and loans are also issued by the team to residents in order to bring empty properties back into use (image above).

## Streetscene Services

A range of services are delivered by the Streetscene teams at South Somerset District Council which include:

- Horticulture - arboriculture, grounds maintenance, sports ground maintenance, flood alleviation works, landscape design, South West in Bloom initiative, adoption of open spaces, management of closed churchyards, operational management of the Yeovil Cemetery.
- Street Cleaning - road and pavement sweeping, litter control, waste bins, flytip management, highway weed control, removal of dead animals from the public highway.
- Plant Nursery - produces bedding plants and planted tubs / baskets for the In-Bloom initiatives in Yeovil, Sherborne and Milborne Port, production of plants for the interior decorative displays / production of shrubs and perennials for use in parks and other public spaces.
- Transport & Vehicle Workshop - management of council's fleet, service and repair of plant and vehicles, taxi testing, supporting multi-agency enforcement actions.

# Hot tips for a low-waste, low-cost summer

For the long days of summer and hopes of a warm autumn, try these tips to recycle more, waste less and save money.

Choose the best that will work for you, or check them all out and see the difference in your purse and rubbish bin.

- Clear freezer space for items that might go off in the fridge, and fridge space to save leftovers.
- Stay safe by keeping the meat for barbecues in the fridge until needed. Provide rubbish and recycling bins.
- After long hot days, recycle your plastic sunscreen bottles, drink cans and antiperspirant aerosols.
- Day out? Take food in reusable containers in cool bags, add reusable bottles for drinks, and buy packaging-free loose fruit.
- Avoid costly and wasteful disposable plates and cutlery; take what you need, then bring it back to wash at home.
- New outfit needed? Try charity shop bargains. If you are having a clear-out take your pre-loved items to the charity shop, recycling site or put out bagged for kerbside pick-up.
- For your overgrown lawn, all recycling sites take garden waste – but do check about van, pick-up and trailer permits.
- Buying anything big? Take card or lots of boxes to recycling sites, avoiding busy weekends if possible.
- And for rain-ruined days, use packaging for creative making-painting days, or swap books and games with friends.

Compost at home and turn your unwanted garden waste, vegetable peelings and non-cooked kitchen waste into a free, nutritious material that puts the goodness back into the garden.

Save money – good compost can make excellent soil conditioner and save time, money and effort.

Improve your environment – the more you compost, the less you send to landfill.

Improve your garden – compost puts nutrition back into the soil, improving your garden or allotment.

# Record-breaking year at The Octagon Theatre


For the first time in its history The Octagon Theatre, Yeovil, has sold 130,000 tickets in over a year. The theatre, which is owned and managed by South Somerset District Council, has seen record attendance during 2016/17.

The theatre has a seating capacity of 622 and provides a diverse programme of live arts events from comedy to opera, ballet and drama, as well as providing a meeting space for local groups and providing a busy schedule of participatory classes through The Octagon Academy. Sales of 130,000 tickets for the 2016/17 financial year saw an increase of 10,000 tickets from the previous 2015/16 financial year.

The high demand for tickets looks set to continue with a busy autumn season coming up that includes 'America's Got Talent' winner Paul Zerdin, 'Milkshake Live!' and the stage production of 'The Tiger Who Came To Tea', Bournemouth Symphony Orchestra, 'Strictly' star Natalie Lowe with 'Strictly Champions' Jay McGuiness and Louis Smith also feature. The Yeovil Literary Festival will welcome Ben Fogle, Monty Don, Michael Portillo, Suzi Quatro and Jeremy Vine (to name but a few) and 10,000 tickets have already been snapped up for the pantomime 'Cinderella'.

Adam Burgan, Arts and Entertainment Venues Manager, said, "The Octagon Theatre is going from strength to strength and it is fantastic to see more people than ever before coming through the door and enjoying a great night of entertainment. The variety of performances and events at The Octagon means there is something for everyone. South Somerset District Council has long prided itself on providing superb arts and entertainment for visitors from right across our district and beyond. This record growth is certainly to be celebrated."

## Investment plans for Yeovil

SSDC is making regeneration in Yeovil a priority and is completing a refresh of the town centre development framework. These are all positive signs for Yeovil. Projects the service has worked on recently include:

- Premier Inn/Beefeater at Station Road
- Regeneration of the Old Creamery and the former Western Gazette offices at Newton Road
- Lidl store at Lysander Road
- Provision of affordable homes at Goldcroft, Queensway Place and West Hendford
- Fighting planning appeals against inappropriate development
- Supporting the iAero Project and Yeovil Innovation Centre applications
- Working closely with the Yeovil Hospital Trust to realise significant infrastructure projects including the 650 space multi-storey car park and newly proposed day surgery unit.

Alongside this is the challenge of working in partnership with others towards the development of 2,500 homes, two primary schools and various community facilities at key residential sites around the town, including the multi-award winning Brimsmore key site.

Work is continuing with developers to bring forward a further 1,500 homes at Up-Mudford and Keyford, a primary school, community facilities and employment space.

With the prospect of the 24 hectare mixed-use Bunford Park scheme, the re-development of Olds Garage by Aldi and the publication of a plan for the town centre, the remainder of 2017 promises to be an important period for the town.

## Safe Summer Food in Eight Easy Steps



### 1 Make sure frozen meat is fully thawed before cooking

Defrost in the fridge or microwave on the defrost setting, not at room temperature



### 2 Keep cold, perishable foods below 5°C

In the fridge, or in a cool box when out and about

### 3 Use different chopping boards and utensils for raw meat

Store raw meat separately from ready-to-eat food




### 4 Pre-cook chicken and pork in the oven

Finish them on the barbecue knowing that the meat is safely cooked through

### 5 Don't overload the barbecue

And remember that disposable barbecues take longer to heat up and to cook food



### 6 Cook burgers, sausages, kebabs, pork and chicken until:

- They're steaming hot
- There is no pink meat
- Any juices run clear

### 7 Don't serve rare burgers

Harmful bacteria may be present in the middle of a pink burger



### 8 Don't leave food out for longer than two hours

One hour if it's very hot outside

## Have you visited the Cartgate Local Food and Drink Markets?

South Somerset District Council has benefited from a share of more than £200,000 of grant funding to support the creation of local food and drink markets at the Cartgate Picnic Site on the A3088.

The Council was awarded the funding through the Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs Championing British Food Tourism scheme grant, launched this year to promote regional food and drink.

Four successful markets have taken place so far and we expect the summer markets to be extremely busy. The markets take place at the Cartgate picnic site on the fourth Saturday of the month between 8.00am and 2.00pm.

Local producers are also encouraged to attend our bi-monthly networking event at the newly refurbished Westlands Leisure Complex in Yeovil. The next event is on Monday 24th July at 10.00am.

## Further smoke detector funding secured for Careline customers

South Somerset Careline has secured £5,000 in funding from Devon & Somerset Fire & Rescue Service, to work in partnership to improve home safety.

The grant has been awarded to increase safety in the homes of Careline's customers.

In the past year, 156 people were referred to the fire service for a Home Safety Visit. 149 free smoke detectors were installed which link directly to Careline's control centre.

The new funding will enable Careline to continue to support vulnerable people by installing a further 250 smoke detectors directly into people's homes.
